

### **Programme notes**

Bach's Goldberg Variations need no introduction. They are one of the most famous pieces for a keyboard instrument and one of the masterpieces of all time.

The MOA Trio took Dmitri Sitkovetsky's version for string trio as its basis for the somewhat radical step of arranging this baroque stroke of genius for clarinet, violin and marimba. Goldberg as you have never heard it before, with new colours and textures that only serve to reinforce the work's timeless transcendence of the physical world.

The MOA Trio commissioned this new work from Lebanese composer Houtaf Khoury with the aim of using the Goldberg Variations as the point of departure for an excursion into our musical times.

Khoury describes this undertaking eloquently:

"As we grow in the world, we inevitably lose the wholeness of our contact with the divine, and as our personalities develop, we in a sense hide behind one particular type and imagine that that represents our totality. It does not - our totality is our divine nature. From this point of view, composing a work based on Bach's music is dangerous because it is a test of humanity and musicality... and anybody can fail. It is a big responsibility I take because of the importance of Bach's music as well because of the freshness of the instrumental combination, a combination between the past and the future. I look forward to this challenge."


### **Artist Biography**
